



UVCEGA SGM

We had the Special General Body Meeting from UVCE Graduates Association on 27th November organized successfully. Around 70 alumni attended the event at KEA, Basaveshwarnagar. This was the first OFFLINE meeting after almost 1.5 years. It was wonderful to see everyone in person after such a long time. Everyone interacted in the beginning with tea-coffee servings and some of them registered as members for UVCE Graduates Association.

As mentioned previously, the main agenda of SGM was to get approval by the Members of the Association to merge the VisionUVCE Trust with UVCEGA. There are couple of changes needed to be made in the By-Law in this regard.

reasons for the proposal to merger which are as below:



After the initial welcome to the committee and the members, Lt Col Sukumaran sir from 1984 EEE proposed the points for the merger of VisionUVCE with UVCEGA. Satish, who is one of the Trustees of VisionUVCE explained the journey in a nutshell and the

- Already being officially under the banner of UVCEGA for over 18 months, all our activities under VisionUVCE is being communicated as being under the umbrella of UVCEGA.
- Having same office bearers (and multiple organizations) may lead to confusion among the alumni community about the goals and objectives of both organizations.
- We like to turn our focus on creating ONE strong and wide alumni platform, which is a member based organization.
- This will help in focussing the entire effort to build strong organization and to be identified as the official alumni organization in the long run.

Later, UVCEGA President, Maj Gen Neelakantappa clarified about few points like why UVCEGA was formed, how VisionUVCE has been doing good work in the past few years etc to the members and why it is a good idea to eventually have one single organization with active members.

Ashok ML 1975 asked query about UVCEAA and the current status. He also wanted to know where and how to donate amount for the initiatives. Nanjundegowda from 1984 asked for intro of the Executive Committee and Office bearers.

Suresh H from 1974 congratulated VU and the initiatives. He mentioned about the Scholarships from a separate Trust by the 1973 batch. He highlighted few queries about the merger (12AA, 8oG, Income Tax Department Permissions, Legalities etc) and shared concerns about the future, where

the efforts of VisionUVCE Team may become futile. His submission was that, it is not good to merge at the moment considering all the facts (considering VisionUVCE perspective).

Ananda B N from 1971 spoke about few points and wanted to welcome VU as part of UVCEGA. He mentioned that 1971 Reunion amount is also being collected by UVCEGA account to help/assist them. He submitted that the merger proposal should be accepted with the terms and conditions decided by the Executive Committee.

Maj Gen Neelakantappa agreed to points of Suresh. He

mentioned that - We will consider obtaining 12AA for UVCEGA shortly. But, the future is not in anyone's hands. So, worrying will not help in any way. We need to move forward with good intentions and hopes that everything will be good.

Later, NG Suresh from 1971 batch wanted to know why we can't continue in the same way - a Trust and an Association being managed separately. He said that unnecessary questions may arise from the members in the future and VisionUVCE may not be able to function freely like it is doing currently.

Madhav from 1985 batch, who is also part of UVCE Foundation was present in the SGM. He shared his experiences about UVCE Foundation, the struggles towards 8oG and FCRA and other concerns. He mentioned that Trust entity will not be considered seriously by the donors or outside community. Association will be taken seriously and when we approach University/Govt with few concerns, it will be heard. UVCEAA, which is supposed to do this, is not responsible enough and hence UVCEGA is the way forward. He also mentioned about getting legal and financial clearances before merging.

Neelakantamurthy from 1971 batch, mentioned we need younger alumni to join the UVCEGA in order to grow. Krishnakumar from 1971 mentioned that if the objectives are same, then what is the need for 2 entities to exist separately?

Satish and Maj Gen Neelakanatappa clarified all the points and answered the questions accordingly. Wg Cmdr HG Dattatreya from 1964 batch suggested talk to lawyer and get clarifications so that there are no issues in the future. Maj General Neelakantappa agreed and said it will be addressed shortly

After the discussion, Satish read the modified version of the agenda - VU to be merged with UVCEGA with the proposed terms and conditions after the consent from the lawyer and auditor. It was proposed by Neelakantamurthy 1971 and Narayanswamy GA approved it and Seetaramu seconded it. Majority of the participants agreed for the resolution by raising their hands.

The next point of the agenda - modification in quorum was kept in front of the audience. After small discussion, it was agreed that the Quorum will continue to be 10% for AGM/SGM with an additional provision that for adjourned meetings (both AGM/SGM) 25 will be the minimum quorum. Suresh H 1973 proposed, Neelakantamurthy 1971 approved it and Narayanswamy GA seconded the same. Majority of the participants agreed for the resolution by raising their hands. After this, Maj Gen Neelakantappa concluded the SGM by thanking everyone.

We had the Monthly meeting after this where the regular updates where shared - UVCEGA Membership, MARVEL (R&D Lab), UVCE Chronicles, UVCE Autonomous status, Updates from campus, students concerns and more.

The entire event expenses was sponsored by HG Dattatreya from 1964 batch and we are thankful to him for the same. We will be updating the website with such generous contributions shortly. We welcome others to join hands as well, since we do not intend to use the Association funds for these meeting/logistics expenses as much as possible.



When I sit to write about VisionUVCE, my memories run back to 2009. I was studying in my final year of engineering. Being a naive 20 year old, I was asking myself 'why does our college not have as many college fests as the other engineering colleges in Bangalore?' Miraculously enough two college fests 'Inspiron' and 'Fiesta' were reinstated. We as the outgoing batch had a blast. We were very thankful to Satish and friends for realizing this for us.

During preparation for campus interviews in final year, I wished we were informed from the first year itself, on the difficulties, areas to work on and focus on communication skills. I hoped we had had better interactions with our seniors, so that we could learn from their mistakes, get a clearer direction to work on getting ourselves. I wondered 'our college has such vast history, but we know very little of our alumnus. How nice would it be to document the past, present and future of our esteemed institution in a magazine'. Somehow all these musings and many more were addressed objectively. None from the college management, faculty, government or any miracles were the cause of this. It was again the sheer love and respect for our UVCE, of Satish and friends again. The sheer zeal of this group, to improve the statute of our own legacy, bringing back the glory of the institute which once educated Sir MV himself. Though from a distance, I've seen the organization grow, from its humble beginnings to an organization, which brought about most of the intended improvements.

During the initial days, the group met up every Saturday as a ritual; shared their ideas with, anybody who would spare a little bit of time. Thus ideated the action plans for VisionUVCE. This ritual of meet up is still kept alive by Satish, despite busy weeks of work. That's the sole fuel which runs the machinery. We still send editions of 'Sampada' every month without fail, which captures the heart beat of UVCE. 




SAE Competition | GoKart 4 Years | 1.5 Lakhs

MARVEL UPDATE


MARVEL has marched closer to enter fully working condition for our first batch, all thanks to the continued team effort of student coordinators at MARVEL and the alumni who have aided us greatly in reaching this point.

A major gain for the lab this past month, is the donation of furniture comprising of 15 tables and a dozen chairs from the batch of 1971. As the MARVEL lab was not able to arrange basic furniture from the institution, we mainly relied on scavenged tables and chairs in various stages of disrepair. The delivery of new furniture to the lab was a breath of fresh air and proved to be absolutely invaluable. We are indebted to the batch of 1971 for this.

In addition to this, we also received a donation of a roomba that serves as a nifty tool for dry sweeping the lab.

Connecting the lab to a stable internet connection was quite the challenging task. What should have been a routine setup from the institution turned out to be a devil's nest. However, MARVEL students handled the situation independently and provided the lab with Ethernet and WiFi, which are essential for all domains.

The 3D printer at the lab saw some action too. Once the computers and other peripherals were setup, cable management became a nightmare. So, the 3D printer was put to practical use when we successfully printed U-shaped wire holders which are in use in the lab.





MARVEL intends to soon kick-start level 1 of our first batch. We conducted a doubtclearing session where students attuned themselves with the day-to-day happenings at MARVEL and the logistics of the lab. They were also briefed on rules pertaining to student conduct and responsibilities in the lab.


We structured a time table and each student was allotted a time-slot to carry out their tasks. A tracking system was put in place to monitor their progress and journal it. Students will be able to upload images/videos/write-ups of their work after every activity is completed. This will ensure that students are systematically climbing the ladder of tasks, and not missing any important rungs along the way.

A TALE OF TWO ARCHITECTS

Sri. S H Lakshminarasappa was the third principal of UVCE from the year 1927-1932. He was a Chief Architect and designed notable landmarks under Mysore Maharaja Krishna Raja Wodeyar's rule. And recently Arvind Krishnaswamy from Bengaluru.com reached out to us regarding the information and photos about him for their story 'Tale of Two Architects'. Here is and excerpt from the amazing article published about his - Sri S H Lakshminarasappa and Prof Krishna Rao Jaisim' s life story. Crossing the Oceans

Liverpool, a maritime city in northwest England is at the estuary of River Mersey and Irish Sea. During the first decade of the twentieth century, the city and the country were in a state of flux. The Victorian era had ended, workers were going on strike, the 'unsinkable' Titanic owned by a Liverpool based company sank in 1912, the city had acquired a reputation of having a high crime rate and the First World War was just around the corner.

It was in these chaotic times that Srinivasarao Harti Lakshminarasappa sailed across the oceans from India and arrived in Liverpool as a student. Born in 1885, Lakshminarasappa came from a family with an agrarian background in North Salem district. He excelled in studies and earned a BA degree with First Class from Central College in Bengaluru in 1903. An interesting contrast in his




performance was that, while he won the Jagirdar of Arni Gold Medal for highest marks in Physical Science, he passed his third language Sanskrit in Third Class! He followed this up with a BE degree in Civil Engineering in 1908, where he was the recipient of The J.A. Jones Prize. This was awarded annually to the candidate who got the highest number of marks in Hydraulic Engineering subject while passing the BE degree (Civil) examination. After graduation, he joined Mysore Public Works Department or PWD as an Assistant Engineer.

It was while he was working in the PWD that he got an opportunity to study architecture in England. In the early 1900s, only about 700 students from India were studying in England. Many of them were scions of royal families from the princely states or from other affluent business families. Most ended up at Oxford or Cambridge to study Law. Some others took courses needed to become civil servants, but few took up architecture.

Lord Lytton's Report of the Committee on Indian Students 1921-22 documents several problems that they experienced when they came to England like little or no recognition of Indian educational qualifications and no friends or point of contact upon arrival in a strange land. There were changes in clothes to suit the local culture and climate. It was extremely difficult to secure lodging and finding familiar food. Since India was in early stages of the freedom struggle, even displaying sentiments of patriotism was viewed with suspicion and made life very difficult.

Lakshminarasappa arrived in England a few years after more familiar names like Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi (in 1888) and Jawaharlal Nehru (in 1905) both of whom studied law at Inner Temple. Listed between Martha Stewart Laing and Jeannette Lancaster, university residence records of 1911 show that he was literally the odd man out. There were no less than 272 students under Faculty of Arts and he was the only one with an Indian name. Picture yourself in his place for a minute and you will appreciate his courage and determination. Being alone in an alien land did not dent his academic prowess and he excelled at Liverpool just as he had done in Bengaluru.

The joy of being part of VisionUVCE (VU) is immense! Somewhere in the year 2015, my music band "8GB RAM" was picking up and we needed a place to practice. Without any hesitation, Mr. Satish AG from VU supported us and had a room within the campus allotted in no time. Since then, that room has been used for various college activities such as Go Green Clean Club (G2C2) and Chakravyuha (Trekking club). Such invaluable contributions and help from the alumni network help the student community vastly. VisionUVCE has always been committed to the betterment of college and the improvement of student life.



Without any hesitation, my friends and I became a part of this wonderful organization. Organizing the centenary marathon was the most memorable of all! The logistics involved and the amount of work put in were immense. I remember walking in Cubbon Park at 11 PM and drawing chalk directions on the road! The event was a grand success! Apart from the above some of the activities that I was involved with VU were the Avalokana event (100th-year Souvenir Release), green plantation drives, and numerous other activities. In a nutshell, there are far too many contributions from VU to college that have created a positive impact on student life. I am grateful for having been part of this great organization in whatever capacity I could contribute. The merging of VU with the UVCE Graduates Association marks a new beginning to the alumni network! I take this opportunity and moment to thank VU for all the help it has provided to the student community and also for providing us an opportunity to be part of it!

Apple's Vice President of Operations, Priya Balasubramaniam is none other our own UVCE Alumni from Batch of 1996 Mechanical Engineering. She recently was a speaker at Bengaluru Tech Summit 2021 and during her keynote on tech, she also spoke about her life growing in Bangalore, her journey to Apple and about UVCE! Apple's partnership with India is expanding in almost every way, said Priya Balasubramaniam, vice president of product operations at Apple, while speaking at the Bengaluru Tech Summit (BTS) 2021 on Thursday.



Priya, a native of Bengaluru began her speech with Kannada congratulating the Karnataka Chief Minister Basavraj Bommai and team for hosting the world-class conclave-like BTS.

"It is a special privilege to represent Apple at a gathering in Bengaluru. Although I'm speaking to you from Apple Park in California, I feel as if I am returning home. I see the Bengaluru Tech Summit as an incredible milestone—not only for me personally but for Apple's growing presence in India," Priya said.

Apple has been in India for two decades and it first began assembling iPhones in Bengaluru in 2017. Apple's supply partners- Wistron Corp, Foxconn, and others-- now have expanded operations to produce multiple iPhone models for both domestic market and for exports.

Priya's Bengaluru connection: Priya Balasubramaniam, as said before, is a native of Bengaluru, delved on her roots during the speech. Priya studied Mechanical Engineering at the University Visvesvaraya College of Engineering (UVCE). She was also pursuing a computer programming course at the same time period.

During her studies at UVCE, Priya was assigned to do research work on major technology companies. While most of her peers picked Microsoft, Intel and others, she picked Apple, which back then, had no presence in India.

Her lecturer was a bit confused by Priya's pick and asked her if she was sure about the choice, as it will be difficult to write a paper on a company, which sold no products at that time. But, Priya, who takes inspiration from Steve Jobs, insisted to work on Apple.

A few years later, Priya got her hands on Apple's colourful Macs for the first time, while pursuing the MBA degree at Michigan State University.

By a happy coincidence, Priya soon landed a dream job at Apple. After two decades, she is now vice president of product operations at Apple. "Let me tell you as a former engineering student from Bengaluru who discovered her passion for operations: today, there could be millions of students across Karnataka, throughout India, and around the world, staying after class to ask questions about Machine Learning and AI... examining iPhones and MacBooks and wondering how they're engineered and these sparks of curiosity could ignite the next generation of manufacturing.

These smart young people are the future of smart manufacturing. As a proud member of the Apple team —and as a proud daughter of Karnataka—I am privileged and excited to help play a part in developing that future and I want to thank everyone involved, including the government of India, " Priya concluded.

1. Money Matters:

- b. - 2. The Experimental Mindset:
- a. Alumni Initiative: Keeping alumni bonded to institution is the most important factor an institution must undertake. Unfortunately, the institution still hasn't taken notable action. Initiatives like VU Sammilana, VU Vaahini, VU Sampada, VU Parichaya, VU Podcast were created and driven. It's still surreal how the team has published consistently for 142 editions of Sampada so far.
- b. Student Initiatives: Giving students an extra exposure in their college days would enrich them as valued future citizen, VU Samvaada an initiative to gather the alumni and students is still an experience many cherish. In a student driven environment, it was essential to recognize those who took that extra step in contributing to college, VU Champs was one such initiative. Student volunteers would be recognized, gifted and were thanked by offering lunch. Out of a million things running in my mind I felt important, and I felt I can do more of what I did.

3. The Big Leap:

- a. Centenary celebrations: 2017 marked the 100th year of establishment of UVCE. Government had its plans; few others had their plans and Vision UVCE organized majority of the events that others failed to. Marathon, Avalokana and UVCE Payana are those events which I've seen the fine draft, worked on the ground and now writing about it as alumni. It gave me the opportunity to meet those individuals in-person who had made remarkable contribution towards this country. I still remember drawing map on roads of Cubbon Park and few months later walking in the same lane with Padma Vibhushan recipient Dr M R Srinivasan.
- b. The Vision Document: Keeping the next few years in mind, VU planned to prepare a vision document for the committee set-up by government, I was asked to search for few things related. It was only then I got to realize how Caltech, Stamford, BITS Pilani and IIT Madras work. The story of College of engineering Pune gave hopes how UVCE can regain its glory. Information about NAAC and NBA accreditation, these are the details that no one cares about among students but are essential for a university. - 4. The Democratic way: The Merger UVCEGA was established for widening the space for alumni to contribute in ways unknown to UVCE. 5. The Empathetic side: Lesser-known side of Vision UVCE is its ability to respond and not showcase about it. I've seen professors contacting VU and requesting to help a student in need and we've simply made that happen. I've seen students ask for emergency fund to organize any fest or even a sponsorship for competition which are at National level to any induction program, on many occasions' institution asking for contact details of alumni and we've done our part. The empathetic side of the trust could always be trusted in listening towards the issue and provide moral support to those in need. Another heartfelt thanks to VU who had helped me in times unimaginable and to have encouraged me.

A lot more can be seen and read in this edition about how VU has contributed but now I want to address it to students who might be reading this. Many have asked me if my involvement with this helps my placement; Will they give a certificate so I can use it in my CV? Do you get "Anything" by them for doing all these activities; Why do you want to miss a trip due to some random activities; Don't college have enough people to sweep it's floors? and what not...! Well, I want to clear all of it now; I got a clear prospective of what a volunteer is and I learnt to adapt, enjoy and embrace change as it comes. These two lessons which takes decades to realize I caught it in my engineering, I'm now benefitting in my professional career due to critical lessons learnt.

Trying to measure in numbers is all we've known; I don't want to quote those because it's beyond numbers which motivated me to be here forever. Not all tasks we've handled is a success, we've failed, we've been experimental, and we have travelled together. Back in 2009 a student group thought of how to give back to our college after they graduated? An institution which set us on a path to chase our dreams - to find our dream jobs, to travel the world, to lead a better life. There started a small spark - VisionUVCE with a primary goal to help the students of college in any way possible.

The scholarship initiative: UVCE is a government college where students come from various background. Many students get scholarship and waivers which pays off their college fees, books expenses, hostel fees etc. But, there were many students who dropped studies mid way as they



did not have money to pay their fees, survive in Bangalore, meet other expenses. So, we set out to find such students, talked to students, conducted interviews, networked with other alumni to talk to students about their college life and circumstances, and requested to pool in the money to help such students get through college. It started small at the beginning and it took almost 5 years to gain the trust and confidence of an alumni network which was more than 100 years old but was localized to a class group or a year batch or a 5 to 10 year group.

Many initiatives like Library project, Students and Alumni interaction, sponsoring class initiatives, fest events, sponsoring students' projects, Best Class competition, placement training programs, industry relationship and networking etc has built a strong bond between the college students and college faculty with VisionUVCE. Sampada- monthly newsletter which gives insight into the events at college, articles by students, faculty members and alumni has been giving regular updates to the alumni. The transparency of VisionUVCE trust by displaying its financial statement every year has gained the confidence of many alumni to help us achieve and succeed in this movement to do more for the welfare of the students and college. It has also helped in building a strong foundation for Alumni association - UVCE graduate association which is an entity built to reach, engage, and connect UVCE alumni with faculty and students. After 12 years of successful run VisionUVCE will be merged into UVCE graduate association to achieve even more greater milestones for the students and the college. I wish all the members who have supported VisionUVCE will support the association in their future endeavors.
