
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EDITORIAL

UVCE AUTONOMOUS 5K RUN

We have always cherished organizing the "Centenary Marathon" that happened on April 2nd, 2017. We witnessed an amazing sight where 800+ participants (students and alumni) wearing the tshirts crossing K R Circle towards Cubbon Park and come back to college. Every participant cherished the moments and wanted more. If we look back, it has already been 6 years since this historic milestone.

So, in a meeting of the UVCEGA Executive Committee, there was a proposal of the same and we went ahead with the plan of organizing another 5K Run, this time to commemorate the Autonomous status of our alma-mater. Since the announcement on January 10th 2023, we have witnessed great energy from the alumni and students side. Within a month's period more than 600 people have registered for the same. We are expecting 1000 people to participate this time, breaking the previous time's record. The necessary arrangements are happening in full force - the permission from the Horticulture Department for Cubbon Park premises has been obtained by paying the necessary fees; the Police Department permission has been requested for; the Sponsors have been approached for financial support; the logistics of Tshirts, medals, banners, breakfast and other things are being worked out.

The ideas is to make this "UVCE Autonomous 5K Run" another most cherished moment for everyone. We want to bring the alumni together on a platform so that "Giving Back to UVCE" can become much stronger. Also, it is an opportunity to build the alumni community - which can also help each other. This will become the driving force for alumni to connect and support within the community. We have seen this happening across various alumni communities like IITs, IIMs, NITs etc. Only when the feeling of "being part of" is imbibed, many wonderful things can be achieved.

1968-73 batch Civil Engineering Graduates of UVCE celebrate 'Golden Jubilee' in Mysuru

Mysore/Mysuru: The 1968-73 batch Civil Engineering Graduates of University Visvesvaraya College of Engineering (UVCE), Bangalore University, celebrated 'Golden Jubilee' at Silent Shores in city recently.

On the occasion, they felicitated their English Professor Dr. C.N. Srinath.

Prof. M. KrishneGowda was the chief guest. Engineer V.N. Prasad was the Celebrations Convener. High ranking professionals and batch-mates from India and Overseas attended.


UVCE was the brainchild of two of India's greatest visionaries — Nalwadi Krishnaraja Wadiyar and Bharat Ratna Sir M. Visvesvaraya (Sir MV).

It was in 1916 – 17, Nalwadi extended full support to Sir MV for the creation of a Centre of Excellence in Engineering fields and thus came into existence the College — then called 'Government Engineering College' and later named after the visionary Sir MV.

"The College was the first Engineering College founded in the then 'Mysore State'; now Karnataka; and only the fifth Engineering College in the entire country. It has produced umpteen luminaries spread all over the world today. Admissions were purely by merit and no capitation fees. Annual tuition fee was less than Rs. 400; nurtured by highly eminent Professors over 'Five Years – Ten Semesters' — with the intent of creating best Engineering Brains," says V.N. Prasad.

"Thanks to the current political dispensation, UVCE is today an 'Autonomous University — akin to the status of IITs or IIMs. The Karnataka Government took the decision on the 15th of September, 2022, when this historic transformation took place. The Autonomy 'DELINKS' the College from Bangalore University and the State is committed to providing annual budgetary allocation, an independent Governing Council and an expert body to prepare syllabi and employ competent teaching and supporting staff to keep up high standard of education in an effort to restore the past glory of the great institute," Prasad added.

Small-town girl from UVCE gets Rs 58-lakh job offer

Keerthi N C could have joined a top private institute, but chose the government-run University Visvesvaraya College of Engineering (UVCE) because she could afford the fees. She now has a job offer that will pay her Rs 58.3 lakh a year. A native of the backward Madhugiri in Tumakuru district, Keerthi received the offer from a California-based cyber security company, setting a placement record at the 106-year-old college founded by Sir M Visvesvaraya.

Keerthi's job offer has set a placement record at UVCE, surpassing a salary package of Rs 49.75 lakh that two UVCE students got from an Australian technology company in 2019. A student of computer science engineering, Keerthi is in her final semester and will write her final exams in August this year.

She is getting paid Rs 1 lakh during her ongoing six-month-long internship at the same company that has given her a job offer. She was

confident of getting a good offer, but the package bowled her over. "I had several rounds of interviews - writing, coding, technical and managerial - and I attempted every round with confidence," Keerthi, 22, told DH. She will be working on data visualisation.

Keerthi said she chose UVCE for two reasons: affordability and less academic pressure. "My rank in the Karnataka Common Entrance Test was 4,000 and I had seats in some top private colleges. But I waited till the last round to get a seat in UVCE because the fee is less and the atmosphere is such that there is freedom for students to prepare on their own," she said.

Keerthi's father Nagaraja G is a teacher at a government primary school at a village in Madhugiri taluk. Her mother Chandrakala is a home-maker. Keerthi has two younger sisters - one in Class 12 and the other Class 10.

The placement season this time at UVCE had 502 students registered of whom 337 got job offers from 71 companies who visited the campus. The average salary package is Rs 10.6 lakh. Three students have received job offers with a salary package of Rs 48.3 lakh per annum from another California-based data software company Fivetran. Eight students got an offer of Rs 24 lakh per annum from SAP Labs, a multinational firm.

"This year, Information Science Engineering and Computer Science branches received equal offers with 82 students from each bagging offers," UVCE training and placement officer B M Rajaprakash said. "Second comes Electronics and Communication Engineering with 67, Electrical and Electronics Engineering with 38, Mechanical 32 and Civil 25 offers," he added.

73 BATCH MEETUP



UVCE IN NEWS

UVCE faculty members choose to remain with Bangalore University

Almost all of the 80 faculty members at the University Visvesvaraya College of Engineering (UVCE) have decided to remain under Bangalore University (BU), which could leave the 106-year-old institution with a severe shortage of teachers. Before being made into an autonomous IIT-like university, the UVCE was the constituent college of BU. UVCE faculty members have decided to request the government to give them an option to choose where they want to be. So far, the government has given options only for non-teaching staff members.

Some of the departments have already conducted meetings and passed resolutions to remain with BU, considering their post-retirement benefits and other services. The civil engineering department has resolved thus: "The department teaching staff expressed their solidarity towards the Bangalore University and resolved to continue to be in Bangalore University. Further, it is resolved to urge the Bangalore University to start a school of engineering in the interest of students and teaching staff."

Even the UVCE Teachers Association, a registered body, has written to BU Registrar requesting for an opt-in and opt-out facility even for teaching faculties. Speaking to DH, Association president HC Chittappa said there is a provision in the law to choose.

"There are 80 teaching staff on the rolls and almost all of them have decided to stay with BU," he said.

He further explained that this was considering the hardship faced by some of the staff who opted out of BU during its bifurcation and trifurcation. "We're ready to support UVCE until they hire new staff, but we all want to remain with BU," Chittappa said.

There are six departments in UVCE of which two departments — Civil and Architecture — are housed at BU's Jnana Bharathi campus.

Meanwhile, some faculty members say they are worried about UVCE becoming too corporate. "Looking at the members on the Board of Governors... we feel it will turn into a corporate world with less importance for academics," a senior faculty member said.

However, BU is in a dilemma. The university does not have an engineering department to accommodate UVCE staff.

About Best Class

We have all discussed about how important it is to develop our personality and attitude when we are in college. Apart from academics, these traits become very pivotal in the future. We will find very little opportunities to learn once we step into the real-world. There will be no guides who will teach these basic essentials required for a better career or personal life, it is all in our hands.

In UVCE, we learn a lot of such qualities along with our friends. This is evident even now



when we watch our senior alumni and the wonderful relationship they have with their batchmates and thereby leading a great life. The amazing memories we recall of the college days, not just along with our classmates, but with our seniors-juniors and other batch friends are so essential that it shapes our approach to any situation.

With this thought, we wanted to compare it with the current situation in the college, where due to numerous technical advancements and distractions, human interaction has become very less. This would create more difficulties in building the community in future, or to become an alumnus or even becoming worthy engineer.

So, to counter this, we started "Best Class" competition - a Social experiment, if we can call it.
