UVCEGA SCHOLARSHIPS INTERVIEWS

We are glad to update about the UVCEGA Scholarships & Certification support initiative this year. As mentioned previously, we had received around 450 applications and we shortlisted 155 of them for interviews: 130 for Scholarships & 25 for Certification Support. They were from across batches and branches.

Interviews were held in college campus (offline mode) after 4 years this time on 22nd February, 2025. This was mainly to get to know the students first hand and communicate with



them in person rather than online. The interview panels had 2 alumni per panel and they evaluate the need of the students together. They were provided certain criteria and also the details of the students who had been shortlisted to know about their application in advance.



Once the interviews were over, we requested the panelists to share the thoughts with everyone in a round-table discussion. This helps everyone to set the basic rules and have some common grounds. This also enables to question each other's perspectives and decisions. We had this discussion for around 1hr and exchanged the suggestions and their panel's evaluation.



From UVCE Graduates Association, we appreciate the panelists spending the time with us and interacting with the students inspite of their busy schedule. It is very challenging to filter the candidates as most of them will be genuine and needy. The students may not be fluent in communication and not forthcoming. We thank the alumni for making them comfortable and giving confidence to the students, which is extremely essential.

Here is what few of the Panelists had to share:

I have been part of scholarship interviews for the past 3-4 years. I volunteer for the interviews because it's an

amazing opportunity to interact with new UVCE minds. It helps me to get to know the current state of college and keeps me connected. Also, while interacting for scholarships, I get to know the difficulties of students. I am very happy with the current process and framework of the UVCEGA Scholarships , since it covers multiple factors and aspects. There will always be opportunities to improve further, but it is a continuous process. I think we are on the right track

Firstly, it was my first time taking the interviews. This volunteering was a really great opportunity as this was one way I could give back something to the college .It also gave me an opportunity to experience something new.

Coming to the students, the interactions were good. The concern is that most of them were not comfortable with English and so we had to speak in Kannada. It is not wrong to speak in your mother tongue, but it will be a huge hurdle in the future (be it interviews for jobs, higher education opportunities, competitive exams etc). We will need to see what can be done about this. But other than that most of the students had a really good attitude and it felt good communicating with them and addressing some of the basic concerns.

This was my first time participating in Scholarships interviews. The whole process was for a great cause - helping our UVCE community truly reach their potential by supporting financial needs for their education. Knowing this, the experience couldn't have been short of rewarding, as we alumni tend to play an important role in having a continuity in the relationship with college to give back after achieving so much because of UVCE.

In each of the interviews, I couldn't help but think what if I was in their shoes. This impacted my perception on the whole thing - these are people who are visibly determined to do great and have the strength to overcome these obstacles - be it to rise up as a provider for the family or clearing accumulated debts. This cemented to me that more numbers from the alumni community should come forward to support our UVCE community to support our people in whatever capacity possible.

I would like to share my two cents about the overall process:

- There were certain cases where more homework on the applicant's end could have been done for why they applied to the Certification Scholarship. The justification for it didn't feel satisfactory. We need to plan it for the next year.
- I am of the opinion that the Laptop slab is essential and "abolishing" it to give way for the higher amount scholarship does not seem like a good enough reason. Many require laptops and while we may be giving them the funds required to buy one on their own, the resource being given to them right off the bat will turn out more fruitful, with lesser of an off-chance students may mis-utilize the funds and come short of purchasing the laptop entirely with what was provided to them via the scholarship programme.

I believe the students could benefit a lot from an active mentor programme. This might be the most valuable scholarship but I do understand the relief a monetary scholarship can provide. Some universities and institutions have a pay forward system and we could consider it as well. A more structured framework is needed for this

UVCEIAN IN LIMELIGHT

Continuing the article about B G Dwarakanath, alumni from 1970 batch from previous edition published in "TradePost" magazine which has some more interesting stories of his career and journey.

Following his stint at HMT, BGD joined Titan Watches in 1985 as Employee No.2, his eventual association with Titan spreading over 30 years, from its inception in 1985 until June

2015. He took possession of the empty land at SIPCOT Industrial Area, situated in Hosur, Tamil Nadu, where the watch manufacturing facilities stand today. In 1986, he led a team of seven engineers to Titan's collaborators - France Ebauches for training on various aspects of movement and watch assembly. He was instrumental and played a key-role in putting together along with his mentors and team a world class watch assembly facility, spending most of his time in recruiting and training new recruits about the intricacies involved in a wristwatch. During the period up to 2004, he established various systems and procedures with a high focus targeted at quality



systems. As "Chief Technology Officer," BGD established and headed New Product development, R&D, Design, and Quality assurance. The focus and challenges were to deliver exceptionally reliable new products within a short time cycle.

He provided leadership and played a key role in the development of the ultra slim, 1.15 mm thin quartz movement/mechanism, as well as the world class range of watches "EDGE" that finally led to winning of the Marico Innovation Foundation Award. This development that took four years of tremendous teamwork, was endorsed and recognised in the books titled "Making Breakthrough Innovation" by author Porus Munshi on "How 11 Indians pulled off the impossible", as well as in "TITAN-Inside India's Most Successful Consumer Brand authored by Vinay Kamath & the "Tata Stories" -an insightful book authored by Harish Bhat.



And as Harish Bhat writes in "Tata Stories" - A fascinating "Make in India" story, which shows how belief, persistence, technology and styling came together to create the slimmest watch TITAN EDGE, one of the most iconic wrist watches: In 1997, BGD and his colleague Subramanya Bhat decided to meet Xarxes Desal, the legendary Managing Director of Titan. They wanted to discuss an audacious project with him, one that no other Indian Company had ever undertaken before. They walked Into Desal's sixth floor

corner office at the Titan headquarters in Bangalore. BGD lost no time in putting forward his proposal. "We would like to manufacture the slimmest watch movement in the world", BGD told Xerxes Desal, a movement as slim as a credit card. Just 1.15 mm, thin, including the battery. "A movement which is robust, and can be maas manufactured for use in beautiful, ultra-slim wrist watches. First time, anywhere in the world." A movement is the engine inside every watch that keeps It moving, and tells the time accurately.

Both Desai and BGD knew that slim movements were extremely rare, because they were so challenging to design and manufacture. Even the few ultra-slim European and Japanese movements which existed then, were produced in very small quantities, were very expensive, in some cases their reliability was in question, and therefore, they were virtually museum pieces. BGD looked at Desai expectantly. "Sir, this will be a real breakthrough for us, something that is world-class and beyond." He saw that Desai was looking at him carefully. His eyes had widened, there was absolute silence. Finally, Desai spoke, in his polished, soft Oxford accent. "Go ahead." BGD and Bhat rushed out of Desal's room. Their hearts were jumping with joy. Their leader was willing to take this risk, invest behind something that had never been done before....





UVCE LIBRARY NEWS

We are delighted to announce that our students now have free access to academic journals and plagiarism software tools. The plagiarism software is provided by INFLIBNET, under the Government of India, at no cost to us. This subscription provides access to various e-journals, including IEEE, Science Direct, Elsevier, Springer, Oxford University Press, ASME, and ASCE etc. This benefit has been extended to us for the past three years. Additionally, through the One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) initiative, our students can now access various journals free of charge.

Many of our students hail from rural backgrounds and may not possess suitable devices to access journals or e-books. We have distributed login credentials to all students through departmental circulars, WhatsApp groups (with over 3,500 students), and notice boards. These credentials enable students to access resources within the university campus network.

Mr. Hari, retired Senior Manager of SBI, and his wife, Shobha, retired Manager of SBI, recently visited the UVCE library. During their visit, they expressed interest in giving back to society and supporting our library. As mentioned earlier, our library had recently acquired a subscription to the One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) program. To facilitate access to these resources, we required desktop computers. Mr. and Mrs. Hari generously donated three desktop computers to our library, which we greatly appreciate.

Mr. Hari and Mrs. Shoba, residents of Bangalore, both retired bankers, dedicated over 39 and 35 years respectively to the banking sector. Beyond their professional achievements, they are cherished by friends and family for their warm personalities and unwavering support. Always present for their loved ones, they embody the essence of familial devotion. In their personal lives, Hari is an avid cook with a keen interest in stock trading. Shoba has a passion for gardening, nurturing a vibrant variety of vegetables and fruits in their garden. Together, they share a love



for travel, having visited over 17 countries so far, and eagerly anticipate exploring more destinations in their retirement years.

Our students are effectively utilizing the available systems to access ONOS resources. In fact, many have suggested establishing a computer lab facility within the library to meet the growing demand.

Regarding e-books, our library is a member of the National Digital Library (NDL) and has access to e-book resources. We also receive e-book facilities through INFLIBNET and UVCE library has taken IISC's institutional membership also , through this also they can access e books Jurnals etc. Furthermore, we are planning partnership with the British Council Library to expand our e-book, journal, and facility offerings, it is under process, hope very soon it will also be done.

Interestingly, many students have expressed a preference for physical books, citing concerns about eye strain from prolonged screen time. Therefore, we aim to provide access to both soft and hard copies of books.

We are also grateful for the support of the Canara Bank Jubilee Education Fund (CBJEF), which has established in 15th September 2023, A book bank at UVCE Library. The CBJEF has provided 1125 print books and continues to donate books annually based on recommendations from our chairpersons and students. Recently, we received 371 new books for this academic year, which is a testament to their commitment to empowering students through CSR activities.

We thank everyone - alumni, other philanthropists for the cooperation, suggestions, and guidance. We kindly request your continued support and guidance as we strive to develop our library further.

75 MECH GOLDEN JUBILEE REUNION


