




CAMPUS SAYS - GRADUATES OF 2015





I remember like yesterday the first time that I met Prof. B.R.Naryana Iyengar during my interview for admission to UCE. He was sitting at the center of the interview table, looking very professorial but not intimidating. Well, anyway I got through the interview and here I am still an Engineer at heart, 50 years after passing out of our esteemed college. I was fortunate enough to have him as our Mechanical Design Professor. I still fondly remember Professors like BRN and MVK who taught the Engineering fundamentals so clearly that they are etched into our brains. When I finished my engineering I went to BRN for a letter of recommendation and in spite of his very busy schedule as the Principal of the college he took time to write a very nice one. I had to go back to him for a small correction and he graciously took care of it right away. In the mean time I learnt from my uncle that BRN was my father's contemporary in UCE. My father Sri L.Vaman Rao, graduated with a Mechanical Engineering Degree in 1929 and worked for Southern Railways. My father was the captain of our college cricket team and actively participated in other sports too. Unfortunately those cricket and athletic genes did not pass on to me. Even though I did get a chance to play for the College Cricket team for one match (against I believe St.Josephs College) I was out the very first ball I faced. Sood, our captain. was gracious enough to give me the College Cricket Cap anyway. I met BRN again in New Delhi in the mid 1970s, when he visited his nephew H.R.Jayaram who was my classmate and a close buddy. We invited BRN for dinner at our place. I had the honour and pleasure of driving him to and from our house. He did remember my father and it was very satisfying to hear about my father from BRN even though it was almost 50 years since they were together in the College. Every time I visit Bangalore and pass by our College I salute and gratefully thank the College for the basic Engineering education that we received and the fun things that we did with our friends and classmates.
